Did you know?



- Remove protections on a DVD or Blu-ray Disk

Our DVD and Blu-ray programs require a decryptor if you want to convert a video that is protected. Check out this guide to find out what to do when your disk is protected.



- How to... change the standard of your video?

DVD players come in two kinds: the ones that read any video standard, and the ones (the majority) who only read their "regional" standard (PAL for Europe and NTSC for the rest of the world). This is why you sometimes cannot play foreign DVDs or need to encode in one specific format. In ConvertXtoDVD, go to "settings" "DVD Specifications" "Video standard" to change the video standard. In DVD and Blu-ray converters, select the NTSC or PAL output.
